Celebrate World Penguin Day at Seneca Park Zoo

Learn all about penguins through keeper chats, feeding demonstrations, and more

April 25, 2019 - Seneca Park Zoo is hosting World Penguin Day on **Saturday, April 27**. Guests will learn all about penguins through keeper chats, feeding demonstrations, up-close encounters with members of the Zoo's African penguin colony, and more. Interactive stations will showcase the Zoo's leadership in penguin breeding, and its work to restore the African penguin population through programs like SAFE: Saving Animals from Extinction. All special programming is free with Zoo admission. A detailed schedule is available at senecaparkzoo.org/conservationdays.

Guests will go home with knowledge about the threats African penguins face in nature, and information about responsible consumerism and other ways they can help protect this endangered species.

For a donation to penguin conservation, guests can enter drawings to win a custom painting made by one of the Zoo's African penguins or to be present for the creation of their own personal painting made by one of the penguins.

Now through October 31, Seneca Park Zoo is open 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., with last entry at 4 p.m.
