

Calling all creative campers! In this camp, we will explore our artistic side with arts and crafts of all kinds. Join us as we get inspired using animals as our opportunity for some crafty fun!

Everyone Grows

Cubs, chicks, and tadpoles! Some baby animals go through some pretty cool changes growing up. Campers learn about the life cycles of some of their favorite animals and what these animals need to do to grow up.

Fur, Feathers, and Scales*

Does your favorite animal have feathers, fur, or something else entirely? In this camp we will explore all the different types of animal coverings at the Zoo.

Hop, Slither, Stomp

CAMP THEME DESCRIPTIONS

Jump, climb, slither and hop to camp! We are moving like the animals this week and learning how animals use their movements to survive in the wild. Meet animals that move in cool ways and practice moving like the animals.

Paws & Claws

Animal feet can be very unique, so join the investigation into paws, hooves, and other feet on your favorite animals!

Reduce, Reuse, Recycle

Learn to go green in this fun camp about how we can help animals from our own homes. Play games and make crafts as we explore the 3 R's!

Super Senses

Animals and people both have senses that help them survive. Campers will get in touch with their senses as they explore how animals see, touch, smell, and hear the world around them.

We are Families

Flocks, herds, and pods, oh my! Some animals like to live in groups with their family and friends, and some don't. Come to camp to meet some social critters to learn if there really is safety in numbers!

7-9 Years Old

Animal Olympics

Meet some animal athletes and learn how their bodies help them to move in incredible ways. Hop, run, and slither to the Animal Olympic games!

Biome Builder

Did you know biomes aren't just in video games? In this camp, we will explore forests, savannas, mountains, and more as well as the animals that live there. We will also use Zoo habitats as inspiration to build our own worlds.

Creatures of the Night

Nocturnal animals usually own the night, but they will rule the day in this camp focusing on animals who prefer the night-time! Campers will explore creatures of the night and the senses that help them thrive.

10-12 Years Old

Animals in Art

Animals are used in art around the world. In this camp, we will use them as inspiration for our own art projects!

Critters in Crisis

Discover the things that can cause animals to become endangered or even extinct; and learn what zoos and you can do to prevent it from happening. It's not too late to save the world's most precious animals if we all do our part.

Naturalists in Training

Learn to be a naturalist in this fun camp, as we explore our local habitat!

Wild About Water - New!

Come get Wild about Water at the Zoo! We will play water games, learn about the water cycle, and discover how different animals use water in their habitats!

Wildlife Heroes

Get to know superheroes in conservation and the animal world! These remarkable people have dedicated their lives to saving wildlife, and you can learn how. Be inspired by their stories and learn how you can help your own favorite animals.

ZooTeens in Training

Want to be a ZooTeen? Learn the roles of a ZooTeen and help educate the public on the animals at the Zoo!

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Registrations are based on the age of the child as of June 1, 2022.

Campers will have a more positive experience if they are prepared to spend a part of each day outside and should dress accordingly, including wearing a face mask. Snacks are provided, but please bring a water bottle.

Seneca Park Zoo is committed to safely offering Summer ZooCamps, as these programs connect children to nature. Campers and staff are required to always wear face masks during the camp day, except when they are eating or drinking. Anyone, staff or camper, who is sick or has someone in their household who is sick, must stay home. Current precautions and cancellation policies are detailed in the ZooCamp FAQ's on our website, and we will notify registrants of any changes.

Preschool camps for ages 3 and 4 are held weekly in June and run from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m., with pick up before lunch. Campers will have a more positive experience if they are already comfortable in group settings, without their parent, and they must be bathroom trained. Two counselors support a maximum of 14 children. Half-day fees apply. Before or After Care options are not available.

School-age camps for ages 5 to 12 begin the week of June 27 and end the week of August 22. Full day is 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. with Before Care drop off at 8 a.m. and After Care pickup at 5 p.m. Campers bring their own peanut-free lunch. Two counselors support a maximum of 20 children.

Special needs camp for ages 5 and 6 is held the week of July 11 and for ages 7 to 9 is held the week of August 15. Three counselors support a maximum of 15 children. This camp is tailored specifically for children with special needs that benefit from additional support. If your child is able to participate in camp but requires individual assistance with communication, behavior support, or ADLs, please contact us about arranging to have your own aide attend with your child, so they may have the most inclusive experience possible.

Half-day option is available for campers ages 5 to 9. Half-day is 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. with pick up before lunch.
