Seneca Park Zoo to celebrate Snow Leopard Day on October 26

October 24, 2019 – Seneca Park Zoo is celebrating Snow Leopard Day this Saturday, October 26. Guests will learn all about snow leopards and their amazing adaptations through keeper chats, enrichment demonstrations at 11 a.m. and 2:30 p.m., interactive stations, and more.

This event is a great opportunity for guests to meet the Zoo's three residents snow leopards - Kaba, Timila, and five-month-old cub Silver - and hear what it's like to care for them directly from the keepers. Guests will also learn about the threats these cold-weather cats face in nature and what they can do in their own lives to help protect them.

For a donation to the Zoo's longtime conservation partner, the Snow Leopard Trust, guests can enter multiple drawings for a chance at winning prizes, including a behind-the-scenes experience and a one-of-a-kind canvas with Silver's paw print.
