Would you make a good predator? Predators have to hunt for their food, and they have a lot of cool adaptations that help them succeed. Come to the Zoo and we'll learn about some of the best predators around!

Slime Time

Slippery, slimy, ooey, and gooey - what animals come to mind? We'll take a look at worms, snakes, frogs, and bugs and discover if they're truly slimy or not.

Web of Life

All animals are connected by the web of life. Learn about producers, consumers, and apex predators in this camp about what animals like to eat!

Wonders of Water

Most of the planet is covered in water, and all living things depend on it. Investigate animals that live in or near water and others that survive with very little water. Campers will test water quality, experiment with the properties of water, and of course discover how animals use water!

10-12 Years Old

Animal Behavior in Action

Many animals at the Zoo are trained to participate in their own health care. Learn about how those animals are trained and what we can learn from watching animal behavior. You may even get to train your fellow campers!

Digging into Paleontology

Paleontologists can learn so much from fossils! Learn what bones can teach us about prehistoric and modern-day animals.

Habitat Design

There are lots of new habitats being planned at the Zoo. Discover how our animal habitats are designed and model one of your own!

Identification Exploration

Animals and plants all have something that makes them super unique! In this camp, we'll explore different ways to identify them based on their awesome differences and see how some are similar as well. From sounds to tracks to leaves, there is something for everyone!

Science Gone Wild

Science takes a wild turn at the Zoo! Discover how we learn about animals through all varieties of science from biology to physics.

ZooTeens in Training

So, you want to be a ZooTeen? Learn the roles of a ZooTeen and help educate the public on the animals at the Zoo!



ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Registrations are based on the age of the child as of June 1.

Campers will have a more positive experience if they are prepared to spend a part of each day outside and should dress accordingly. Snacks are provided, but please bring a water bottle.

Preschool camps for ages 3 and 4 are held weekly in June and run from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. with pick up before lunch. Campers will have a more positive experience if they are already comfortable in group settings without their parent, and they must be bathroom trained. Two counselors support a maximum of 14 children. Half-day fees apply. Before or After Care options are not available.

School-age camps for ages 5 to 12 begin the first week of July and end the week of August 19. Full day is 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. with Before Care drop off at 8 a.m. and After Care pickup at 5 p.m. Campers bring their own peanut-free lunch. Two counselors support a maximum of 20 children.

Special needs camp for ages 5 and 6 is held the week of July 8 and for ages 7 to 9 is held the week of August 12. Three counselors support a maximum of 14 children. This camp is tailored specifically for children with special needs that benefit from additional support. If your child is able to participate in camp but requires individual assistance with communication, behavior support, or ADLs, please contact us about arranging to have your own aide attend with your child, so they may have the most inclusive experience possible.

Half-day option is available for campers ages 5 to 9. Half-day is 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. with pick up before lunch.
