SENECA PARK ZOO INVITED TO PROVIDE TWO LIVE FEEDS FROM ANIMAL HABITATS FOR GOOD MORNING AMERICA'S PROGRAM ON ECLIPSE DAY

Rochester, NY – Monroe County Executive Adam Bello and the Seneca Park Zoo have announced that live feeds of animal habitats will be provided to Good Morning America for their broadcast use. Good Morning America will have access to live feeds of Anoki the Polar Bear and the otters Gary, Ashkii and Sailor habitat during their 7 a.m. – 9 a.m. broadcast on April 8.

“Seneca Park Zoo is a local gem that is always looking for new ways to educate the community about the animals that call the zoo home,” **said County Executive Adam Bello**. “It will be great national platform to show off the Zoo while also learning more about animal behavior during a total solar eclipse.”
