Inside a sensory bag are items I can use to feel calm while I visit the Zoo. I can use headphones in areas that are too loud. I can use fidget toys to keep me focused.



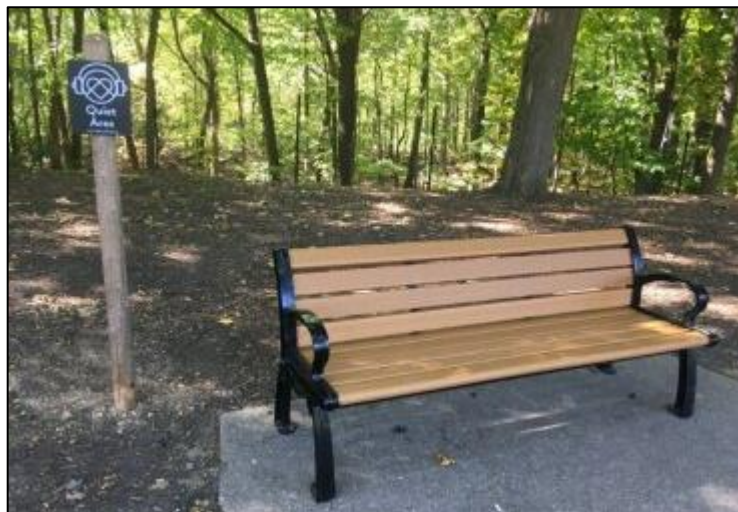
If I need help or if I have questions, I can ask a Zoo staff member.

This sign tells me that this area is a place I can come to relax if I need a break.



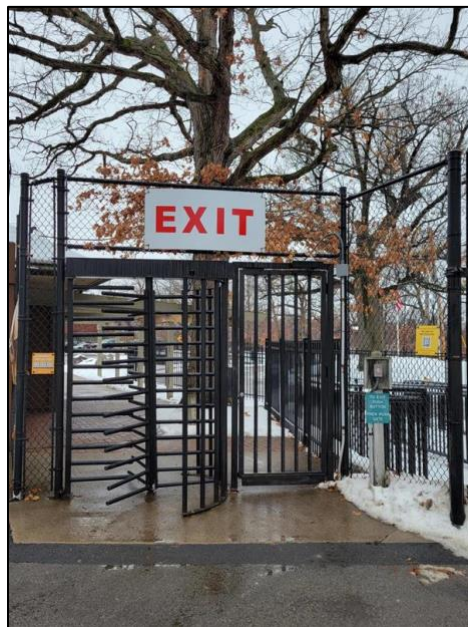
There are many different smells at the Zoo. If I don't like a particular smell, I can go to another part of the Zoo.
